An extra £1.54 million was provided by the Welsh Government as part of the funding floor for the Local Authorities with the lowest settlements.</li> <li>As a result of the Monmouthshire scrutiny and consultation on the budget, it has been agreed not to cut the opening hours of the libraries/community hubs. Monmouth library wi stay at its current location. Unfortunately, all but 11 schools are expecting to finish their financial year having spent more than they received in funding.</li> <li>However, the council fees and charges. In England council tax rises cannot be 5% or more without a local referendum unless an exception is made by the Government. It means that number of English councils set the council tax increase at 4.99%.
